A permit, when granted, covers a period not to exceed three years. A permit may be renewed after the three-year period, provided water from the well is tested and a safe water sample has been obtained from the well annually. The results of such tests shall be submitted annually to NGLW. There is a \$25.00 renewal charge.			
NGLW reserves the right to revoke a well permit application at any time if the well or pumping system is found to be operated or maintained in a way that maybe in a harmful to the location or the Village of New Glarus.			

PROCEDURE FOR OBTAINING A WELL OPERATION PERMIT

A permit may be granted to a well owner to operate a private well, providing the following requirements are met:

1. Applicant’s well and pumps installation, at a minimum, meets the requirements of Chapter NR 112 of the Wisconsin Administrative Code.
2. Applicant has shown that no physical connection shall exist between the piping of the public water system and the private well. Inspection by NGLW is required. It is the responsibility of the Owner to contact NGLW to set up an appointment.
3. Applicant has submitted a copy to NGLW of the well constructor’s report, which is on-file with the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (WDNR), or certification of the acceptability of the well has been granted by the Private Water Supply Section of the WDNR. If the applicant doesn’t have either, the applicant shall retain a DNR licensed well contractor to inspect the well. A copy of the well inspection shall be submitted to NGLW.
4. Applicant has provided test results showing that the well has a history of producing safe water and presently produces bacteriological safe water as evidenced by three samplings two weeks apart. These tests results shall be obtained from a private certified lab or a Wisconsin DNR lab.
5. The Applicant has shown that the proposed use of the well is justified as being necessary in addition to water provided by the public water system.
6. The Applicant has completed the Well Operation Permit Application form, and has submitted it to the NGLW with the permit fee of \$25.00.

ANNUAL TESTING

This permit is granted to the Owner of the well at the location, to operate a well for a period not to exceed three (3) years provided the well water is tested and a safe water sample has been obtained from the well annually. The results of such tests shall be submitted annually to NGLW.
